Financial Aid Policy

We believe that no serious and dedicated student should be denied access to education due to financial deficiency barriers. The Financial Aid Service at BBS exists to support students financially throughout their educational journey. BBS is committed to caring for each student individually and assisting as many qualified students as possible.

Beirut Baptist School is a non-profit educational social institution. Thus, the school can provide financial assistance only to a limited number of students, based on a request submitted by parents before the due date set by the administration in order to include the requested assistance in the following year budget if approved.

This aid, however, does not cover books, transportation or school uniforms. The financial aid requests submitted to the school are thoroughly studied by the Financial Aid Committee, which takes into consideration the student's need, academic performance and behavior. The financial aid will be granted to the neediest families within the limits of the amount allocated for financial aid in the school's budget.

We work according to our vision and mission:

Vision:

To develop students into life-long learners by cultivating ethical goals that respect individual abilities and cultural diversity as well as the development of the student holistically. At BBS, we aim at having: Students who establish a positive image on a well-founded academic and social base, diligent teachers who enjoy their work and the students they are teaching, parents who are more than satisfied about the growth of their children at BBS, and Owners who are pleased with BBS's Christian foundation, enrolment levels, well-endowed facilities and financial health

Mission:

To prepare students in mind, body, and spirit to meet the challenges of the world around them. The school continues to share the spiritual concerns of its founders and their mission to promote the love of God and of country, and to liberate the mind and soul from the bondage of ignorance and fear; hence our motto is as Jesus said:

“You shall know the truth, and the truth will set you free” (John 8:32).

1. Policies and procedures/conditions

- 1- Only complete applications (*including all required documents*) will be processed.
- 2- Financial aid is granted for one school year and conditioned on a commitment to schedule the installments that will be agreed upon.
- 3- A new application is required for each new academic year.
- 4- Financial Aid is not given to new students.
- 5- The administration alone has the right to accept or reject the request.
- 6- The administration has the full right to request verification for all information provided to make good decisions.
- 7- Financial Aid will be canceled if the student leaves the school before the end of the academic year.
- 8- All information in the application form remains confidential, and the school administration does not provide any details about it to anyone.
- 9- Additional information and documents will be requested if needed
- 10- Submitting an application does not imply approval of financial aid.
- 11- Financial aid is provided on the following grounds:
 - a- Real need (*including the annual income for the family*)
 - b- Student academic success/ Students who fail academically will not receive financial aid.
 - c- The good behavior of the student (*At least B on the conduct*)
- 12- Registration for the next academic year is a must before applying to finalize the decision for the Financial Aid.

2. How and when to apply

Financial Aid Applications can be found at school or on the BBS website and should be submitted by the end of June. No application will be accepted after the deadline.

The following steps are required when applying for Financial Aid:

- 1- Guardians must present a printed and signed copy of the application, along with all supporting documents, at the Financial Aid Office at school.
- 2- Administration will assign an appointment for an interview with one of the guardians to provide relevant detailed information regarding the family's financial status and to help in assessing the needs.
- 3- The Financial Aid committee will study the applications.
- 4- The Financial Aid Committee will inform the guardian of the decision as to whether the application was accepted or rejected via e-mail, a message on EduFlag, or a phone call.
